Rhodesian Golden Helmet Match Race: Bob Raw beat Doug Serrurier

This match, the very first speedway meeting in Southern Rhodesia, was held at the conclusion of the Royal Agricultural Show, and the teams were a mixture of riders from South Africa (S A), Southern Rhodesia (S R), and Northern Rhodesia (N R).

The track was 470 yards long and appears to have had four distinct corners.

A 3-lap track record of 70.1 secs was set in the final heat of the match.

The attendance was 12,000 - a record for a sporting event in Bulawayo, and a quarter of the town's population.

Bert Clark, of Northern Rhodesia, became the first Rhodesian to ride in the UK when he rode for the ill-fated Edinburgh team in 1954.

The above details have been researched by Ken MacLeod from the Herald (Salisbury) and the Chronicle (Bulawayo).

Important - The British speedway press referred to this as a 5-match series, i.e. excluding the matches at Port Elizabeth

and Cape Town, which were deemed unofficial. However, research carried out by Ken MacLeod in the South African press: the Star (Johannesburg), the Rand Daily Mail, the Natal Daily News, and Sapa (South African Press Association) - has now confirmed that all seven matches were officially part of the series. However, the programme for the 19th 2nd that Bulawayo refers to it as the 3rd Test (not 5th). Yes, I'm confused too!

This series was run on tracks controlled by Buddy Fuller's South African Riders' Association, and outside the jurisdiction of the South African Control Board, who declared all the matches to be unofficial, and all the competing riders suspended.
